Many of you have expressed concern at what impact the result of the EU referendum might have on your eligibility for studentships.

EU referendum implications

The university has produced a webpage specifically for students that summarises many of the key questions and answers that have arisen from this issue, which can be found at http://www.ox.ac.uk/students/eureferendum.

In addition, Research Councils UK (RCUK), the overall umbrella organisation

that brings together all seven UK research councils (of which the ESRC is one), has released a statement on the EU referendum, which can be found at http://www.rcuk.ac.uk/media/news/160706/. The last item in the statement refers to their studentship policy. Finally, the ESRC have further clarified that "those students who have already

satisfied our residential criteria and therefore are in receipt of a full award would not change in anyway at this time as a result of the referendum".

These should all provide some reassurance. At this stage, we are unable to provide any further information beyond the above pages/statements.

RTSG limits - policy change Following a review of the total expenditure claimed back by DTC students on

RTSG, the decision has been taken to introduce a cap on the total cumulative

If you who wish to make claims exceeding this new limit, you will be required to submit a full academic case for the expenses to the DTC, providing an overview of why the expenses are deemed to be essential and in direct support of their research, as well as a supervisor's statement of support. This case for support should be no more than one side of A4 in length. The documentation will then be forwarded to either the DTC Director or DTC Deputy Director for final approval. This process will need to completed IN ADVANCE

of any expenditure being committed. This policy change is effective immediately (i.e. as of 22/07/2016), and applies to all of those students who have already exceeded a total of £3,000 (£4,000 for AQM students) claimed on RTSG. The policy change does not apply to claims received today/already in process prior to this date. Guidance notes on the DTC website will be updated shortly to reflect the new policy. Operating the scheme in this manner will ensure that the grant is more sustainable, in particular for those students who have yet to claim on RTSG, including cohorts that have not yet commenced their studentships.
